### 12:15 PM OPENING COMMENTS LEE CARLSON

DISCUSSION	As Lee opened the meeting, Daryl Specter announced to the membership that a QUORUM was reached again this year and that the meeting will continue in its entirety.
The 2010 Show Schedule was presented to indicate the dates and the areas where shows will be held. All show bids were completed online and the results will be announced later in the meeting.	
A review of the agenda was held and the meeting continued. An Organizational Chart to show the relationship of the BOD, E-Committee, and the Director of Operations was presented to the membership. The chart also indicated the offices open for nomination to the E-Committee: VP of Finance and VP of Public Relations. Nominations and voting to take place towards the end of this meeting. A second organizational chart was also presented to provide an overview of the WGASC Operations Staff.

### 12:40 PM MARKETING REPORT KRISTIN JOHNSON

DISCUSSION	Kristin Johnson, Marketing Coordinator presented summarized information on 2009 sponsorships:
2-new sponsors were added for the 2009 season: Thank you to PLATINUM SPONSORS (\$3500 each) Creative Costume & Design, Designs by King, Hare Designs, and Visual Designs Concept (product donation); no DIAMOND SPONSORS (\$2500) for 2009; GOLD SPONSORS (\$1500) Charles Frey Photography, Pop's Original, and Gard's Music (new to 2009); and SILVER SPONSORS (\$500) Xplode Signs (product donations). We lost 3-sponsors from 2008.	
CONCLUSIONS	80% of the sponsorship funds go directly to the Scholarship Fund; and the remaining 20% helps offset marketing expenses.

### 12:50 PM SCHOLARSHIPS LYNNE KUNSTER

DISCUSSION	The first chart showed a comparison of the number of performers in all classifications from 2006 through 2009. It was pointed out that the "A" classes have comprised from 91% to 93% of total
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	performers in all classes over the past 4-years. The most significant growth was in Regional AA.
	The next chart showed the breakdown of scholarship recipients for 2009 by region. Congratulations to the winners from Riverside/SB Counties Jenna Larson from La Quinta HS, Katherine Nguyen from Palm Desert HS, Sharon Goude from Cajon HS, Jennifer Cuellar of Los Osos, Denise Gallo of Paloma Valley HS, and Ashley Diaz of Chaffey HS. The winners from LA/Ventura Counties were Katie Walters of Littlerock HS, Ana Cortez of Narbonne HS, Anantha Singarajah of Diamond Bar HS, and Krista Steuben of Rancho Cucamonga HS. The winners from Orange County included Alexandra Ailport of Mission Viejo, Alicia Lykins of Orange Lutheran, Michelle Caunca of Trabuco Hills HS, and Heidi Reely of Savanna HS. And, finally, from San Diego, the scholarship winners were Marianne Encarnacion of Mira Mesa HS, Agata Siwinska of Coronado HS, Jenzel Manalansan of Mira Mesa HS, Raiza Amiling of El Camino HS, Sheriemaine and Sherielaine Edquilang of Eastlake HS.
	The next chart showed history of scholarship awards by region from 2004 – 2009. The total value of scholarships awarded this year was \$16,000, lower as compared to 2008. Due to the loss a couple of sponsors and the economy, we're hopeful that 2010 will be the year the economy turns around. Twenty (20) scholarships were awarded valued at \$800 each.
<b>CONCLUSIONS</b>	In 2010, the scholarship applications will be submitted totally online via PDF with a go-live date of 12/10/09. At the Fall Educational Clinic, a workshop will be provided by Peggy Bilbruck on "How to Apply for a Scholarship."
	The goals for 2010 is to increase the scholarship funds by 10% through re-instituting the 50/50 raffle at all contests, adding a line to the membership application for a donation of \$2, \$20, or \$200. \$2 increments is in recognition of WGASC's 20 <sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

**1:05 PM MBOS REPORT MIKE STONE**

<b>DISCUSSION</b>	MBOS 2009 will offer 3-shows plus our 2 <sup>nd</sup> Annual MBOS Championships. The show sites and schedule are as follows:	
	10/17 – Downey HS; 10/24 – Roosevelt HS hosted by Norco HS; 11/7 – Mission Hills HS hosted by Lealta and MHHS; 11/14 – MBOS Championships at Roosevelt HS. A new website dedicated to MBOS will go LIVE before the end of May 2009 and registration will begin the same day (planning for May 18 <sup>th</sup> ). It was decided that all shows must be on turf fields. Judging panels have all been finalized and will also be included on the website when it goes LIVE.	
	A question was raised by the membership to consider a Color Guard Award and Percussion Award. Mike Stone advised it is not a part of the MBOS philosophy to separate visual (guard) or music (percussion) from the other musicians/visual performers. He did say he would look into perhaps an overall Guard, Percussion award as part of the finals contest and/or the Championships Show. Lee Carlson encouraged all members to make every effort to support MBOS as an addition to their regular fall season band shows.

**1:20 PM WINTER GUARD SEASON REPORT CARL NELSON**

<b>DISCUSSION</b>	WGASC hosted 1-Debut and 5-Invitationals. 4 out of 5 of the Invitationals reached the maximum of 70 units. The digital voice recorders were utilized at all shows this season, including Championships. All regular circuit contests were well attended and all ran smoothly with little or no complaints. At Circuit Championships six full shows over the course of 2-days at Aliso Niguel HS, JSerra HS, Capo Valley HS, Tesoro HS, San Juan Hills HS, and UCI's Bren Center; 340+ performances; and over 4,000 performers Carl expressed his gratitude to all show hosts for a fantastic and successful 2009 season.	
	The 2009 Contest Staff was comprised of 5-Contest Directors, 13 announcers, 10 tabulators/digital judging. THANK YOU to Tracy Williams for preparing all of our judges' sheets and show host supply packs for the season. THANK YOU also to Billy Park for his time and support on the tab and digital judge programs.	
	A question was raised by the membership asking why JSerra has been able to bid for shows when they're not members of the organization. See action below.	
	Carl reported that WGASC sold the MP3 program to WGI already, along with 4-other circuits – thanks to Billy Park. Funds received go back to offset the technology improvement expenses.	
<b>CONCLUSIONS</b>	The 2010 Schedule for WGASC hosted events have all been finalized and will be held on the following locations: Debut/Eval Show at Roosevelt HS, Corona; OC Invitational at JSerra, San Juan Capistrano; San Bernardino Invitational at Redlands East Valley HS, Redlands; Riverside Invitational at Murrieta Valley HS, Murrieta; SD Invitational at Westview HS, San Diego; and the LA/Ventura Invitational at Westlake HS, Westlake Village. Both shows on March 27 <sup>th</sup> will offer a 70 unit maximum.	
	2010 plans are to update the Tab program to better serve the membership and the judges, upgrade the digital judge program to provide playback in MP3 format, research and test the ability of the announcer to "upload" unit soundtracks to a laptop for playback, provide member units with an MP3 player for digital judge comments, and to increase staff with additional Tabulators/digital judge; Announcers; and Contest Directors.	



Carl also presented the technology improvement of allowing instructors to upload soundtracks, downloaded onto a laptop by the Announcer or the Contest Director the Wednesday or Thursday before show weekend. If all works out, at a minimum, we will beta test in 2010 at the WGASC hosted events with plans to fully implement at all contests by 2011.

**1:50 PM JUDGES REPORT RICHARD KRAMER**

**DISCUSSION** As the judges' representative, Richard reported 2009 accomplishments, comments and concerns: (1) Judges continued to participate in open communication to ensure their needs and questions were addressed; (2) Brought in judges limited to WGASC needs; (3) Shortage of Movement Judges; (4) Larger class of individuals interested in judging attended sessions in Fall and trialed at contests; (5) Need more training and accountability in 2010; and overall, felt that 2009 was a successful season with a positive outlook for 2010.

Goals for 2010 include: (1) Recruit new judges. Note: 3-new judges are on track for approval in 2010 (Movement, Ensemble and Equipment); (2) Renew focus on training for all judges. Note: Establish consistency between new and old; and accountability to the system, numbers and guards. Because of the restructuring of the Debut and Evaluation Shows, training for the judges will occur all day for all judges with feedback exchange; (3) Process feedback to judges' performance. Note: Use of the Chief Judge Committee, Mentors and Caption Facilitators; and (4) Exchange judges with other associations; and (5) Maintain consistency of adjudication.

Chief Judge Committee: (1) Committee of 6-7 judges; (2) 1-member of this committee will be the Chief Judge at every show; (3) Responsible for reporting concerns or other judge-related issues to the Judges' Coordinator; (4) Assists Classification Committee in identifying potential promotions by reviewing numbers and discussing groups with panel after each portion of the contest and review at conclusion; and by reporting findings and recommendations to the Director of Education. A question was raised by the membership as to whether or not we will include out-of-town judges as part of the Chief Judge Committee. Currently, all members will be local judges at this time.

Judges' Education:

- (1) At Debut/Evaluation show 1-day training for all judges (new and returning) will take place.
  - Judges education with 4-caption facilitators
  - Split into 5-panels, facilitators would be the 5<sup>th</sup> panel
  - Panel critiques with all units in each round
  - T&P meeting and judging final 2-rounds
- (2) Facilitators become Mentors all season
  - Audio file exchange and feedback
  - Mid-season and post-season feedback
  - Enhanced mentoring process, numbers consistency
- (3) 2010 education will focus accountability with numbers management and mentoring process
- (4) Mentors contracted are:
  - George Oliviero
  - Shirlee Dorrittee
  - Michael Turner
  - Curtis Costanza

A comment was made that there was no feedback on the Mentoring Program to the Advisory Committee and therefore, seem to be a lack of communication, leadership, initiative or direction?

Paperless Judging

- (1) Elimination of score sheets estimated to save the WGASC over \$4,000.
- (2) (2) Judges would use a score recording sheet and switch out with recorders every 4 or 5 guards
- (3) No change to T&P, will still use sheets to record penalties
- (4) Eventually, the plan is to utilize a PDA device (or similar) to record both scores and commentary

2010 score sheets to be made available at time of membership payment. It will be the responsibility of the instructor to know the backside of the sheet.

**2:20 PM EDUCATION REPORT CHRIS CASTEEL**

**DISCUSSION** The 2008 Education Clinic was held at Fountain Valley HS and featured Shirlee Dorrittee, Jenn Johnson, Greg Llacer, Brian Nunez, and George Oliviero. However, the clinic was not well attended.

For 2009, the Education Webinar is tentatively planned for September 12, 2009. A membership questionnaire was distributed at check-in requesting input on educational topic suggestions. By introducing the Webinar approach, we hope to reach a larger audience, digitally record and allow for future playback. Chris also reported that she and Scott are working on a "Frequently Asked Questions" (FAQs) directory. Concept is under current development.

Education Articles: In 2009 20 articles were published on the WGASC website. Contributors included Chris Casteel, Greg Mar, and Catina Anderson. The 2009-2010 publication schedule will be as follows:

- April 2009 thru September 2009 MONTHLY
- September 2009 thru January 2010 BI-MONTHLY
- January 2010 thru April 2010 WEEKLY

Members of the Classification Committee are: Chris Casteel, Educational Coordinator; Richard Kramer, VP Adjudication; Robert Solomon, Judges' Coordinator; Jim Goodrich, Instructor and Non-Judge; and Linda Bergslien, Instructor and Non-Judge.

Reclassification of Promotion Considerations included:

- (1) Gross score received at the contest reaching or exceeding the review number
- (2) The number of judges who felt the unit was demonstrating strong skills within their respective caption
- (3) Which captions the unit was demonstrating strong growth
- (4) References to the criteria of the particular classification (backside of the score sheets)
- (5) References to the criteria of the new classification (if changing sheets)
- (6) Number of competitions the unit will be attending in the future
- (7) The time between competitions the unit will be attending

Classification Procedures:

- (1) Committee conference calls on Sunday evenings – Topics include a discussion of the scores from that weekend, "watch-list" of color guards, contest dynamics, judging panels, and input provided by judges from the specific shows.
- (2) E-mail sent to the Director of Operations on Sunday evenings informing him of the committee decisions
- (3) E-mail sent to units who were to be reclassified or promoted by Wednesday evening
- (4) Show schedules altered to reflect change in classifications

The promotions and re-classifications made for 2009 were displayed for the membership. Anyone wanting a copy of this report should contact Chris Casteel directly.

**CONCLUSIONS** Lee made very positive comments about the improvements and hard work that Chris Casteel has done for the WGASC. Thank you, Chris!

At this time, Lee introduced the concept of Individual and Ensemble Competitions which would allow anyone, including instructors to compete in A, Open, or World classes individually or as a 4-member ensemble specializing in movement, flag, rifle, sabre or all. Performers would not have to be members. The recommended entry fee would be \$20 along with the use of only 1-judge. Contests could be held in performing arts theatres, cafeterias, or any place with a high ceiling. Details on this concept to follow at a later date. Action items on this concept were recorded on the E-Committee Meeting Minutes of 4/26/09.

Lee also stated "yes" WGASC is looking into getting a FACEBOOK page and TWITTER page.

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**3:50 PM EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ELECTION LEE CARLSON**

<b>DISCUSSION</b>	Lee announced that Lynne is stepping down and nominations are open for her position. Two offices were open for nomination: Vice President of Public Relations/Marketing and the Vice President of Finance:
	Nominees for VP of Public Relations/Marketing were 1) Jeffrey Sterrett (nominated by Ben Contreras) and 2) Robert Hahn (nominated by Lorraine Kohagen)
	Nominee for VP of Finance was Dan Mack (nominated by Jaycee Clarke)
<b>CONCLUSIONS</b>	At the end of the meeting, Daryl Specter announced the new E-Committee members. The new VP of Public Relations/Marketing is Robert Hahn and Dan Mack will return as the VP of Finance.

**4:00 PM NEW BUSINESS LEE CARLSON**

<b>DISCUSSION</b>	1) Speaking for the Board of Directors, Greg Llacer reported that the BOD has recommended a REWRITE of the By-Laws in 2009-2010. Due to the growth of the organization, the Policy and Procedure Manual also needs more definition of its processes. This was discussed earlier today with a couple of the E-Committee members.	
	2) Lee announced that the E-Committee is still pursuing Health Insurance for its instructors. He announced that both he and Scott ran into dead ends and found that it was not suited to our association because "units" make up its membership, not individuals, aside from the fact that WGASC is not structured to support a full-time staff member for health insurance. Nevertheless, Lee mentioned that Lynne is looking at another insurance broker to see if we should still pursue this idea.	
	3) Lee also announced the appointment of Missy Samson to be the "communications check" person for WGASC. She will read the website daily for clarity and to prevent misinterpretation.	
	4) The membership brought up an issue that arose during Guard Check-In at Circuit Championships. See action noted below.	
	5) The membership inquired as to why their Director Badges would not work at the Bren Center. Scott advised that additional wristbands were provided to each unit. Due to the high number of Director Badges and a related Ticketmaster policy (which is only an issue with the Bren Center) it could not be allowed. Chris Velez thought perhaps a different colored badge might resolve the issue. Limited to 3-colors for E-Committee, Advisory Committee, and Instructors with names and titles. After much discussion, Scott agreed to take this under advisement.
