1:30 PM **OPENING COMMENTS** **LEE CARLSON**

DISCUSSION As Lee opened the meeting, Daryl Spector announced to the membership that a QUORUM was reached again this year and that the meeting will continue in its entirety.

Lee stated that the beginning of the meeting would be a bit out of order due to two circumstances. The 1st being 10 Rule Proposals received after the deadline and seen on Sunday Morning. Membership was asked to vote if the Proposal should be reviewed and membership voted no. Rule Proposal Number #3 was also brought up and explained (membership Discussed and Votes see section of Proposal for more notes) The 2011 Show Schedule was presented to indicate the dates and the areas where shows will be held. All show bids were completed online and the results will be announced later in the meeting.

A review of the agenda was held and the meeting continued. An Organizational Chart to show the relationship of the BOD, E-Committee, and the Director of Operations was presented to the membership. The chart also indicated the offices open for nomination to the E-Committee: President and VP of Records. Nominations and voting to take place towards the end of this meeting. A second organizational chart was also presented to provide an overview of the WGASC Operations Staff.

1:50 PM **REVIEW OF 2009 MINUTES** **DEBORAH GIBSON**

DISCUSSION Copies of the 2009 Annual Circuit Meeting were passed out to all attendees at check-in and were presented to the membership for review and acceptance by Debby Gibson.

CONCLUSIONS A motion to accept the 2009 Annual Circuit Meeting Minutes was made by **Jim Barton** passed by membership.

1:55 PM **FINANCIAL REPORT** **DAN MACK**

DISCUSSION 1. Overall Financial Profile of the Association showing Membership Income, Other Income, and Overall Expenses from FY 2005 thru FY 2009 (as of March 2010 month-end).

2. Overview of Contest Expenses showing Budget and Actual from FY 2005 thru FY 2010 (as of March 2010 month-end) Questions were fielded from membership.

12:59 PM **MARKETING REPORT** **ROBERT HAHN**

DISCUSSION Robert Hahn, Marketing Coordinator presented summarized information on 2010 sponsorships:

Thank you to PLATINUM SPONSORS (\$3500 each) Creative Costume & Design, Designs by King, and Visual Designs Concept (product donation); DIAMOND SPONSORS (\$2500) for 2010 Pops' Original; GOLD SPONSORS (\$1500) Charles Frey Photography, and NO SILVER SPONSORS (\$500) for 2010. We lost 2-sponsors from 2010.

CONCLUSIONS 80% of the sponsorship funds go directly to the Scholarship Fund; and the remaining 20% helps offset marketing expenses.

12:50 PM **SCHOLARSHIPS** **ROBERT HAHN**

DISCUSSION The first chart showed a comparison of the number of performers in all classifications from 2006 through 2010. It was pointed out that the "A" classes have comprised from 91% to 93% of total performers in all classes over the past 4-years. The most significant growth was in Regional A & Intermediate A.

The next chart showed the breakdown of scholarship recipients for 2010 by region. Congratulations to the winners from Riverside/SB Counties Alexis Benner-Vista Murrieta, Nicola Hetrick-Temecula Valley, Katherine Hipp-LaQuinta, Erica Walls-Palm Desert. The winners from LA/Ventura Counties were Jena Avila-San Dimas, Ashley Ho-Wilson, Jessica Lin-Rowland, Rene Ordon-Los Altos, Jasmine Serna-Los Altos, Kaitlyn Trillo-LaSerna, Sammi Wong-Arcadia. The winners from Orange County included Cynthia Diaz-Century, Victoria Escobedo-Century, Tam Phan Escobedo-Bolsa Grande, Emily Rivera-El Modena, Heather Wormmeester-Trabuco Hills. And, finally, from San Diego, the scholarship winners were Vania Gomez-San Pasquel.

The next chart showed history of scholarship awards by region from 2004 – 2010. The total value of scholarships awarded this year was \$14,000, lower as compared to 2009. Due to the loss a couple of sponsors and the economy, we're hopeful that 2011 will be the year the economy turns around. Thirteen (13) scholarships were awarded.

CONCLUSIONS	In 2010, the scholarship applications will be submitted totally online via PDF. There were some problems with the process, but E-Committee is looking at improving the process again. A total of 67 applications were turn in and evaluated. The committee included Hahn, Baker, Knuster, Carlson, and P Billbruck.

2:00 PM MBOS REPORT MIKE STONE

DISCUSSION	MBOS 2010 will offer 3-shows plus our 3rd Annual MBOS Championships. The show sites and schedule are as follows:

10/16 – Monrovia HS; 10/23 – Downey HS; 11/6 – Vista Murrieta HS and MBOS Championships at Roosevelt HS. It was decided that all shows must be on turf fields. Judging panels have all been finalized and will also be included on the website when it goes LIVE. It was also announce to membership that for the 2nd year MBOS has made a profit, \$10,000 was deposited into a CD for emergencies such as weather or other emergences. Questions were fielded from membership, questions included when payments are due, and profit made by MBOS. It was stated that MBOS lives under the umbrella of WGASC and it does belong WGASC, there is also a CD for WGASC for the same kind of emergences.

2:22 PM WINTER GUARD SEASON REPORT CARL NELSON

DISCUSSION	WGASC hosted 1-Debut and 5-Invitationals. 4 out of 5 of the Invitational's reached the maximum of 70 units. The digital voice recorders were utilized at all shows this season, including Championships. All regular circuit contests were well attended and all ran smoothly with little or no complaints. At Circuit Championships six full shows over the course of 2-days (Santiago, Roosevelt, Etiwanda, Los Osos and Rancho Cucamonga High Schools) Carl expressed his gratitude to all show hosts for a fantastic and successful 2010 season. All Circuit show were well attended.

The 2010 Contest Staff was comprised of 6-Contest Directors, 13 announcers, 10 tabulators/digital judging. THANK YOU to Tracy Williams for helping with the copyright paperwork. THANK YOU also to Billy Park for his time and support on the tab program (Paperless Judging) and digital judge programs. THANK YOU to Keith Brady for his insight on technology on all sound systems. WGASC once again lead the nation with its paperless judging system, many other circuits are using it and most will paperless next season.

CONCLUSIONS	The 2011 Schedule for WGASC hosted events have all been finalized and will be held on the following locations: Debut/Eval Show at South Hills HS; OC Invitational at Marina HS; San Bernardino Invitational at Rancho Cucamonga HS; Riverside Invitational at Riverside King HS, Murrieta; SD Invitational at Westview HS, San Diego; and the LA/Ventura Invitational at Glendora HS. This year WGASC will add 3 additional show the last weekend of scores (2 Friday, 2 Saturday and 2 Sunday)

Goals for 2011 are to update the Tab program to better serve the membership and the judges, upgrade the digital judge program to provide playback in MP3 format, research and test the ability of the announcer to "upload" unit soundtracks to a laptop for playback, provide member units with an MP3 player for digital judge comments, and to increase staff with additional Tabulators/digital judge; Announcers; and Contest Directors.

Carl also presented the technology improvement of allowing instructors to upload soundtracks, downloaded onto a laptop by the Announcer or the Contest Director the Wednesday or Thursday before show weekend. WGASC did test this in 2010 at the WGASC hosted event and plans to fully implement at all contests by 2011. Increase staff or the 2011 season.

2:46 PM JUDGES REPORT RICHARD KRAMER

DISCUSSION	As the judges' representative, Richard reported <u>2010 accomplishments, comments and concerns</u> : (1) Continued recruiting of new judges (2) Renew focus on training for all judges (3) Process feedback on judges performance (4) Established Chief Judge Committee (5) Utilized Caption specific Facilitators for training and judges review (6) Instituted the Paperless judging system (7) Successful season with a positive outlook for 2011.

Goals for 2011 include: **Continue to Recruit new judges** Note:(1)Several new judges are on track for approval in 2011; (2) Target specific individuals to work with caption facilitators; (3) Goal is to maximize improvement of these judges for 2011/2012. **Continue to focus on training for all judges** (1) Establish consistency for all judges (Webinars to focus on several topics) (2) Accountability to the system, numbers and guards. **Process feedback on judges performance** (1) Part of accountability focus, use of mentors, will included use of video. **Exchange judges with other associations.**

Chief Judge Committee: (1) Selection of several Judges to act as Chief Judges (2) One Chief Judge at every show (3) No additional fee in 2011 (4) Responsible for reporting concerns or other judge related issues to Judge Coordinator (5) Assist Classification Committee in identifying potential promotions (review of numbers & discuss groups with panel after each portion of the contest & review at conclusion; review finding & recommendations via login at show sites)

Judges' Education:

(1) Evaluation Show/Training Day/One day training for all judges (new & returning)

- Judges education with 4-caption facilitators
- Switch from classroom sessions to clinic portion as needed
- All judges to make comments for all units in each round
- T&P meeting and judging final 2-rounds

(2) Facilitators become Mentors all season

- Audio file exchange and feedback (add video for 2011)
- Mid-season and post-season feedback
- Enhanced mentoring process, focus on caption needs.

(3) 2011 education will focus accountability, numbers management and mentoring process

Bret Dunlap commented that there was no feedback on the Mentoring Program, there seemed to be a lack of communication, leadership, initiative or direction? WGASC agreed that there were some issues, which is why we are position the position of Judges Coordinator to fix issues like this. Others (Laura Baker and Missy Sampson) stated they thought the feed back was great and learned much from their mentors.

Paperless Judging

(1) Elimination of score sheets estimated to save the WGASC over \$4,000 in 2010.

(2) Eventually, the plan is to utilize a PDA device (or similar) to record both scores and commentary

Judges Coordinator for 2011

- Position was into used in 2010, will bring back for 2011.
- Responsibility for all judging assignments
- Act as Coordinator between Caption Facilitators and Judges
- Evaluate recaps and review numbers management after each show
- Assist with season wrap up and evaluation of judges performance evaluations
- Posting should take place in the next few months.

Questions from membership: Are outside judges going to be evaluated? How will the Judges Coordinator job be filled? What is being done about numbers management?

EDUCATION REPORT

CHRIS CASTEEL

DISCUSSION Two Education Webinar were held in 2009-2010. Karl Lowe did one on design and George Olivero on Ensemble Analysis, both were very well viewed. In 2010-2011 WGASC has planned 3 to 4 Webinars.

Education Articles: In 2010 12 articles were published on the WGASC website. "People of WGASC" series was started this season.

Members of the Classification Committee are: Chris Casteel, Educational Coordinator; Richard Kramer, VP Adjudication; Jim Goodrich, Instructor and Non-Judge; and Linda Bergslien, Instructor and Non-Judge and Jeff Sterrett, Instructor and Non-Judge

Reclassification of Promotion Considerations included:

- (1) Gross score received at the contest reaching or exceeding the review number
- (2) The number of judges who felt the unit was demonstrating strong skills within their respective caption
- (3) Which captions the unit was demonstrating strong growth
- (4) References to the criteria of the particular classification (backside of the score sheets)
- (5) References to the criteria of the new classification (if changing sheets)
- (6) Number of competitions the unit will be attending in the future
- (7) The time between competitions the unit will be attending

Classification Procedures:

- (1) Committee conference calls on Sunday evenings – Topics include a discussion of the scores from that weekend, "watch-list" of color guards, contest dynamics, judging panels, and input provided by the chief judge from the specific shows.
- (2) E-mail sent to the Director of Operations on Sunday evenings informing him of the committee decisions
- (3) E-mail sent to units who were to be reclassified or promoted by Wednesday evening
- (4) Show schedules altered to reflect change in classifications

The promotions and re-classifications made for 2010 were displayed for the membership. Anyone wanting a copy of this report should contact Chris Casteel directly.

Questions form the floor included: Are units ever moved back if they are not successful, yes 2 units did do that in 2010. Directors can always contact Chris if they have concerns over re-classification. Why is there only one unit in the highest level of JH Class? **LEE MADE VERY POSITIVE COMMENTS ABOUT THE IMPROVEMENTS AND HARD WORK THAT CHRIS**

PROPOSAL #3	Allow a show host only a 2 year commitment. After 2 years the show host will not be able to bid for 1 year. (Submitted by Peter Gomez)
JUSTIFICATION	Because of "Luck of the Draw" some show hosts have been lucky enough to host shows for several years. This will allow different units the opportunity to possibly get selected.
CONCLUSIONS	CALL FOR VOTE AFTER DISCUSSION BY MEMBERSHIP VOTE: Defeated
PROPOSAL #4	Allow 5 all access passes to each unit and do away with wristbands at shows except for performing members. (Submitted Peter Gomez)
JUSTIFICATION	There are too many wristbands circulating through shows not allowing show sponsors to maximize their income from "the gate".
CONCLUSIONS	AMEND wording "All Access passes" to "STAFF BADGES" CALL for the Vote by Carl Nelson, 2 nd by Linda Bergslien VOTE: PASSED by Membership
PROPOSAL #5	Reinstate double panels for Sunday finals. (Submitted Advisory Committee)
JUSTIFICATION	This idea was brought to the advisory committee by several instructors this season. The circuit originally stopped doing this because of a lack of available judges and cost. This is a lone event and there are enough judges available to achieve this. It is up to the membership if they are willing to accept this cost
CONCLUSIONS	Discussions opened, Dan Mack, VP of Finance reported to membership there would be financial implications from the passage of this rule. It would cost units in Classes Intermediate A, Scholastic A-Open and World and all Independent organization an extra fee of \$25-\$50 dollars per unit. Jenn Johnson wanted to remind all membership of the financial implication of the rule. CALL for the Vote by Jenn Johnson, 2 nd by Jeff Strert VOTE: PASSED by Membership
PROPOSAL #6	Championships contests in A classes with a prelims/finals format, Open Class and World Class will be adjudicated by double panels. (Submitted Greg Llacer)
JUSTIFICATION	WGI wisely has moved back to a double-panel format, and so should we, especially for the A classes where individual caption strengths of performing units and scoring anomalies can impact contest results. The mathematical principle of averages will contribute to assuring that placement at finals is as accurate as we can get it.
CONCLUSIONS	Withdrawn by Greg Llacer
PROPOSAL #7	Championships – Procedural rule: "The three (3) medalist units from all Scholastic Intermediate "A" Class and Scholastic "A" Class preliminary rounds on Saturday plus the next three highest scores regardless or rounds will return to the Sunday championship contest to compete in Finals," change to the next three highest 4th place scores. (Submitted Regina Naylor)
JUSTIFICATION	Scores tend to increase as day progresses. Placement, not score, should determine which groups move onto Sunday contest.
CONCLUSIONS	Discussion open, Greg Llacer feels justification is state wrong, explained his thoughts why. CALL for the Vote by Jim Barton, 2 nd by Esther Kamp VOTE: Defeated
PROPOSAL #8	Units whose scores in a prelims round to identify finalists in circuit championships (Int A, SchA) fall below the cut-off but higher than the lowest bronze medalist automatically will be reviewed by the VP/Adjudication, Contest Director, and chief judge to determine if they should be considered for an additional slot in Finals. (Submitted Greg Llacer)
JUSTIFICATION	Given the broader range of variables in a local prelims contest that cannot be ameliorated by seeding, the likelihood of a scoring anomaly due to contest dynamics and variability in caption placement is higher. So, a worthy competitor kept out of the final rounds of these classes is a real and unfortunate possibility. If within these training classes our primary goal is education, the rigid forms of a 15-finalist round does not seem as compelling given the opportunity to analyze the complete contest to determine if indeed a higher scoring non-medalist should be included. Judges likely would be more mindful of contest spreads and placement, placement in rounds by total score and caption, and scoring spreads by caption. The review group reserves the right to determine additional finalists based on evidentiary review, which after a decision is rendered cannot be appealed.
CONCLUSIONS	Discussion open, Greg Llacer talked of his justifications; Lee explained the E-Committee response of they we feel the proposal would not work. Contest directors, VP of Adjudication are not always viewing the show and cannot be at all sites.

	CALL for the Vote by Frank Delarosa, 2 nd by Esther Kamp VOTE: Defeated
PROPOSAL #9	Add additional contests during the entire month of March. Two shows Friday, Saturday and Sunday each weekend in March. Or, if possible, suspend the 100 mile rule, and have 3 contests on Saturdays, one per county. (Submitted Regina Naylor)
JUSTIFICATION	Too many guards, not enough available contests.
CONCLUSIONS	Discussion by membership CALL for the Vote by Jim Barton, 2 nd by Chris Case VOTE: Defeated
PROPOSAL #10	Post blank score sheet/rubric on the WGASC webpage. (Submitted Regina Naylor)
JUSTIFICATION	To allow students/instructors to view sheets.
CONCLUSIONS	Not a rule change, and is already on website under resources.
PROPOSAL #11	Current Rule: 2.4 All measurements shall be made from the center of the front boundary line. The centerline shall be marked by a 6-inch line at the front and back center line. Change to: 2.4 All measurements shall be made from the center of the front boundary line. The centerline shall be completely marked from the front center mark to the back center mark. (Submitted Corkie Keys)
JUSTIFICATION	We still have many units in the WGASC that do not use tarps. Most rehearse on outdoor basketball courts. Having the center line (or "50") marked at contests will give those units a consistent reference point to the center of the competition space.
CONCLUSIONS	Discussion by membership Call for the vote by Chris Case, 2 nd by Jim Barton VOTE: PASSED by Membership
PROPOSAL #12	Each unit may only sign up to attend one show the final weekend that scores count for championship seating. After January 2 nd when all available show spots are available a unit may sign up for an additional show that weekend. (Submitted Executive Committee)
JUSTIFICATION	This will allow the major of the membership to receive a score the final weekend scores count for championship seating.
CONCLUSIONS	Discussion by membership Call for the vote by Jim Barton, 2 nd by Ether Kamp VOTE: PASSED by Membership
PROPOSAL #13	Only one (1) high score from each unit per competition weekend (Friday, Saturday and Sunday) may be counted toward the high score average for championships seating. (Submitted Esther Kamp)
JUSTIFICATION	To allow unit ranking scores for championship seating to reflect true growth and improvement throughout the competitive season rather than end of season inflation as it effects placement for seating.
CONCLUSIONS	Discussion by membership Call for the vote by Carl Nelson VOTE: Defeated
PROPOSAL #14	Move championship weekend to the weekend prior to world championships. Season should begin on 3 rd weekend of January. (Submitted Peter Gomez)
JUSTIFICATION	Performing as late as we do does not allow enough of a cooling down period before auditions and summer programs resulting in "burn out" of staffs and members.
CONCLUSIONS	Discussion opened with Lee Carlson informing membership this would not be effective until 2012 because of the schedule already in place for 2011. Discussion by membership Call for a vote by Jim Barton, 2 nd by Chris Velez VOTE: Defeated
PROPOSAL #15	No longer offer critique at WGASC competitions: (Submitted Executive Committee)

JUSTIFICATION	Staffs are not coming prepared for critique; they are not listening to judges' comments. Members sign up on a regular basis for critique and do not come. Ending critique will allow WGASC to add more guards to a show.
CONCLUSIONS	Discussion by membership Call for the vote by Jenn Johnson, 2 nd by Jay Kamp VOTE: Defeated

5:50 PM EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ELECTION LEE CARLSON

DISCUSSION	Lee announced that he was stepping down and nominations are open for his position. Two offices were open for nomination: Vice President of Records and the office of President, Greg Llacer explained the by-law change and the addition of the 2 tier system if a candidate does not have 50% plus one of the vote, we would need to do a run off. Call for nominations from the floor, NONE.
