Classification Committee Report Joey Valenzuela

Guard Proposals Greg Llacer

#1: Policy: Chadd Hartman (Chino Hills HS)

Proposal: Current Seeding: Currently, championship seeding scores are calculated by averaging 70% of highest score and 30% of next highest scores a unit receives throughout the season.

Proposed Change: All colorguards, regardless of class, will be seeded in tournament style rounds for championships using their most recent score increased by 1.5 points each week of the competition calendar through the last seeding weekend of the competition season.

Justification: This change creates a more accurate reflection of a unit's likely performance level at the end of the season by simulating natural growth and improvement. * It alleviates the current pressure for units to compete in two shows during the final seeding weekend.

Proposal: Rule Proposal for WGASC Championships Performance Order: Effective Classifications: * Independent A * Senior Independent A * Scholastic Open * Independent Open * Scholastic World * Independent World Proposal Title: Championships Performance Order Seeding for Non-Prelims Classes,

Proposal: Currently, Independent A, Senior Independent A, Scholastic Open, Independent Open, Scholastic World, and Independent World classes do not participate in a prelims round at WGASC Championships. As a result, their performance order on Championships day is randomized. This randomization does not reflect each ensemble's performance level throughout the season. This proposal recommends that for the above classes, the performance order at WGASC Championships be determined by each ensemble's Championship Seeded Score. Groups would perform in reverse order of their Championship Seeded Score (i.e., the ensemble with the highest seeded score performs last, second highest performs second to last, etc.).

Rational: Rationale: Currently, the performance order for the listed classes at WGASC Championships is determined through randomization due to the absence of a prelims round. This method does not accurately represent each ensemble's competitive achievements or performance level leading into Championships. By utilizing each group's Championship Seeded Score to determine performance order, this proposal ensures that the competitive structure remains consistent with the season's scoring outcomes. It maintains competitive integrity by aligning Championships performance order with how ensembles have placed throughout the season, rather than relying on chance.

Proposal: WGASC Rule Proposal: Access to Recap Prior to Critique

Proposal Title: Recap Distribution Prior to Critique

Proposal Summary: To ensure that unit directors and representatives can engage in productive and informed dialogue during critique sessions, this rule proposes that all units attending critique be provided with their full recap and score prior to entering critique. Regardless of whether awards have been completed. This information may be distributed digitally or in print by the contest director or designated contest staff.

Proposed Rule Language: "All units electing to attend critique must be provided with their complete recap and adjudicated scores prior to entering critique. The recap may be distributed

in either printed or digital format by the contest director or an appointed staff member. The availability of recaps shall not be contingent on the conclusion of the awards ceremony. This measure ensures that unit representatives are able to prepare adequately and engage in meaningful, data-informed discussions with adjudicators."

Rational: Currently, many critiques occur immediately after performances, often before units have access to any scoring or ranking data. This results in unit directors entering critique without essential context, diminishing the value and effectiveness of the dialogue with adjudicators. By guaranteeing access to recaps beforehand, this rule supports more constructive, focused critique sessions, ultimately enhancing the educational value of the experience for all participating units.

#3: Rule Proposal

Proposer: Chadd Hartman (Chino Hills HS)

Proposal: Modification of Special Request Consideration for Scholastic A and AA Classes at Championships No Current Rule for this: Currently, directors or representatives of participating units may submit a "Special Request" for WGASC Championships. These requests allow for accommodations to ensure that programs with multiple units do not have performance time conflicts or that a director is able to be present for multiple ensembles. Proposed Change: Special Requests submitted for scheduling accommodations at WGASC Championships shall no longer affect or alter the competitive seeding, performance order, or round groupings for units in Scholastic A and Scholastic AA classes. Special Requests may still be honored in a logistical sense for all other classes, but they will not be used as a basis for reassigning groups or modifying round placements for these two classes.

Rational: The current implementation of Special Requests has a significant impact on the competitive integrity of the Scholastic A and AA classes. Adjustments made to accommodate these requests frequently override seeding based on season-long performance scores, resulting in: * Disruption of fair and balanced round groupings; * Scenarios where high-performing groups are unfairly displaced from finals due to reassignments; By excluding Scholastic A and AA from Special Request-based group realignment, this proposal preserves the merit-based seeding system that is critical to competitive fairness at Championships, while still allowing for some logistical flexibility where appropriate.

Review of 2025

- **Directors must add all staff members to CompSuite**
 - Staff members need to be added to CompSuite in case of emergencies that occur at venues
 - All staff members can receive real time updates about the progress of an event when inclement weather or other delays occur
- **Wristband & Badge Policy:** Strict enforcement to prevent abuse; focus on student safety when lifting equipment
 - A staff badge does NOT take the place of a wristband
 - Wristbands are the only item that allows entry into a performance space
- **Class Updates:**
 - New: *Novice & Standstill*
 - Defined Regional A/Open/World

- Junior vs Senior High split
- **Site Issues Raised:**
 - Percussion needs better venues
 - Misunderstanding over “Signature Show” (suggest rename to “Semifinals”/better educate and communicate to membership)
 - Request for percussion and winds reps at sites
 - Championship venue issues due to weather and electronics delay

#1 Proposer: Tim McElearney (Workman HS)

Proposal: RECLASSIFICATION PROCEDURES AND CRITERIA Groups will not be reclassified based on isolated data from one contest. A group shall not be reclassified based on only one caption, but a clear and consistent pattern among two or more captions. If there is a request to reclassify a unit, the unit will receive a report from the requestor with specific criteria for the request and notice of entering a probation period. A unit notified of possible reclassification can dispute the probation before the next contest. A unit can be reclassified after the cutoff date if they had already entered probation, including going into championships.

Financial impact: None, Per Author

Justification: The group will only be reclassified after a second contest where there is a clear and consistent pattern amongst two or more captions. Using two separate contests allows for contest dynamics to be a smaller part of the decision and for the criteria to be considered with more information available.

PROPOSAL FAILS

#2 Proposer: Tim McElearn (Workman HS) WITHDRAWN

Proposal: Director/Staff Wristbands Band director and staff will receive wristbands based on the names listed on competition suite receiving a badge. Students will receive wristbands based on the ensemble size.

Financial impact: unknown, Per author

Justification: Band director and staff now are only given one badge. If there is a problem with abuse of badges (being passed around), this has been mostly remedied by insisting on a badge + wristband policy. You could even request staff provide an employee badge since it is standard

WGASC Fact Check: Staff Wristbands are distributed using the following criteria according to membership level purchased for the season by the ensemble (6, 8 or 10 plus 1 for the Director). Director badges are a courtesy and not a tool used for obtaining a wristband. In addition if a unit needs an additional wristband they may purchase All Access Passes to be used during the regular season.

#3 Proposer: Angela Tousley (El Dorado HS) WITHDRAWN

Proposal: WGASC will send a feedback survey to all units that participated in a WGASC contest over the previous weekend. The survey should be sent on the Monday following the event. The goal is to gather timely and relevant input from participating units to help improve the overall contest experience. The survey should include questions about: facilities, judging, parking, warm-up zones, performance venue, and any additional comments or suggestions.

Financial impact: Minimal, however the proposal does require administrative action.

Justification: Collecting feedback from the units who were directly involved in the event will provide meaningful insight for WGASC administrators and event partners as they continue to refine and enhance each contest.
